Prairie Gold celebrates new Midwestern literature

Prairie Gold: An Anthology of the American Heartland is a collection of all new writing that explores and celebrates Midwestern culture and identity. Edited by Lance M. Sacknoff, Xavier Cavazos, and Stefanie Brook Trout, the book was released July 1, 2014, by Ice Cube Press, an Iowan book publisher.

The anthology includes 11 short stories, 13 essays, and 86 poems from 67 contributors, whose diverse perspectives speak to the complexity of the Midwestern experience.

"Each story in *Prairie Gold* extends beyond a perspective on a landscape; these stories tell us how Midwesterners define themselves."

Prairie Gold features introductions by award-winning Midwestern authors Dean Bakopoulos, author of Please Don't Come Back from the Moon, My American Unhappiness, and the forthcoming Summerlong; Debra Marquart, author of five books including her memoir The Horizontal World: Growing up Wild in the Middle of Nowhere; and Mary Swander, Poet Laureate of the State of Iowa, whose latest book of poetry is The Girls on the Roof.

The release party will be August 29, 7:00 PM – 9:00 PM at Design on Main in Ames, Iowa.
